

The soprano Sabine Ritterbusch, who comes from Bad Pyrmont, studied at the Musikhochschule Detmold and passed her singing teacher exam, the matriculation exam and the concert exam with distinction.

In 1993, her very first audition at an opera house brought the exceptional singer an engagement at the Hamburg State Opera, where she celebrated many successes.

The versatile singer has also made guest appearances at other major opera houses, including the Bavarian State Opera in Munich, the Semperoper in Dresden, the State Opera and the German Opera in Berlin, the Deutsche Oper am Rhein in Düsseldorf and the Aalto Music Theater in Essen, under the direction of Daniel Barenboim, Frieder Bernius, Ivor Bolton, Ingo Metzmacher, Helmuth Rilling, Peter Schreier, Stefan Soltesz and Christian Thielemann.

In addition, Sabine Ritterbusch is an internationally sought-after lied and concert singer at home and abroad. Her CD with songs by Alma and Gustav Mahler received outstanding reviews in the international press and was awarded a silver medal by DIAPASON France. Sabine Ritterbusch has performed in radio productions (WDR, NDR, SWR, SFB, Radio Bremen), CD recordings (conducted by Frieder Bernius, Gerd Albrecht and Wolfgang Helbich, among others) and television productions for ZDF, NDR and ARTE. Sabine Ritterbusch teaches as professor of voice at the Hanover University of Music, Drama and Media.
